### 2013 MEMBER of the YEAR

## Al Fortuna

My introduction to BMW dates back to August 5, 1972, at West German Imports in Ambler, Pennsylvania. I was logging 700 to 800 business miles a week in a 1968 cherry red Karmann Ghia and desperately needed air-conditioning. I really wanted a new Porsche 912 (list price \$5,285) but was concerned about the effects of A/C on an air-cooled engine. A friend suggested that I check out a BMW. I opted to test drive a new 2002tii (Inca) believing that the additional horsepower would compensate for the load of the A/C. The rest is history! In 1977, I purchased a new RS100 beamer which more than satisfied my need for speed. Our respective professional activities developed to the point that neither Connie nor I had any time to waste on commuting, so we purchased a condominium on the thirtieth floor of Academy House, a new high-rise adjacent to the Academy of Music in the heart of Philadelphia. Our demanding work schedules allowed no time for fun and recreation, so we sold our automobiles, my motorcycle and sailboat.

Connie and I relocated from central Philadelphia to Florida in June, 1998. We had not owned an automobile (or motorcycle) for eleven years. Two months later, we took delivery of our 1999 328i (alpine white) with a five-speed manual transmission. The E46 was a reliable workhorse that thrived on the daily high-speed commute from our home in Port Saint Lucie to my office in Palm Beach Gardens. When I retired on September 30, 2005, "Angie" and I had covered more than 152,000 miles of intense driving. Despite the unavoidable "road rash" on the front bumper cover, the bimmer was still beautiful. Connie and I enjoyed several trouble -free road trips and decided to keep the vehicle. After three years of the good life, I splurged on new brake pads and rotors on all four wheels. My technician at Coggins Treasure Coast BMW was amazed to see original pads and rotors on a ten-year old vehicle with 157,000 miles. Three months later, I returned to the dealership for an annual maintenance check-up and "low mileage" oil change. While the car was on the lift, I wandered into the showroom to peruse the "eye candy" and checkout the MSRPs for the latest offerings from BMW. My eyes became fixated on an alpine white M3 coupe with a carbon fiber roof. It was so elegantly formal looking with its black novillo extended leather interior. And three pedals! Once again, the rest is history. This E92 M3 is my ultimate bimmer and she is definitely a "keeper."

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#### The Basics of Long-Term Care Insurance

Thinking about the need and the costs of long-term care is enough to make anyone uncomfortable. But while it's a difficult subject to talk about, it's also a topic that often generates lots of questions and misunderstanding.

Consider this: The average cost of nursing home care in the United States now exceeds \$87,000 per year, with wide-ranging variations from state to state.\*

#### Who Pays?

For the most part, those who need long-term care are left to foot the bill on their own. Neither Medicare, nor Medicare supplemental coverage ("Medigap"), nor standard health insurance policies cover long-term care unless you are impoverished. That's why long-term care insurance is so important. Since premium costs are based on your age and health at the time of purchase, the younger and healthier you are when you purchase a policy, the lower the premium you're apt to pay during the life of the plan.

As you evaluate long-term care insurance, keep the following variables in mind:

- Coverage Parameters. Policies will differ in the types of services they support. Be sure to choose a policy that best meets your particular needs.
- Benefits Payout. How much does the policy pay per day for care in a particular setting? How does the policy pay out? (e.g., a fixed daily amount, as reimbursement for the cost of care up to a daily maximum?) Does the policy have a maximum lifetime limit?
- Eligibility. Does the policy use certain "triggers" to determine benefits eligibility, such as the formal diagnosis of an illness or disability? What is the maximum issue age for the policy?
- Women May Need More. Longer life spans for women may signal the need for additional coverage.

Finally, keep in mind that most long-term care policies sold today are federally tax qualified, which means premiums paid and out-of-pocket expenses are deductible. Also, long-term care benefits received are not taxed as income up to certain limits.
